

Publication Ethics Guidelines

Editorial Responsibilities

All publications are the responsibility of the Editors of *The New American Antiquarian*. The Editors are tasked with maintaining the below principles and practices, in consultation with the Editorial Board.

The Editors will evaluate manuscripts only for scholarly quality, without regard to the race, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, ethnicity, or citizenship of the authors.

The Editors will not disclose the identity of the authors of manuscripts to potential reviewers, reviewers, editorial advisers, or any other party for the duration of the review period. The Editors will not disclose the identity of reviewers to the authors of manuscripts or publications at any time without the written permission of the reviewers.

The Editors will not charge authors submission fees or any other fees for expenses incurred in the editing, production, or distribution of publications.

The Editors will not personally profit from funds obtained at any time from the licensing of publications or bibliographic data.

Authorial Responsibilities

Authors will submit entirely original works that do not infringe upon the intellectual property of any other individuals or entities, that are not substantially published elsewhere, and that properly acknowledge through citation existing scholarship from which they have drawn significant influence.
